

# Alternate English Language Proficiency Assessments for California

## Scale Score Ranges



The Alternate English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (Alternate ELPAC) provide a consistent, standardized measurement of English language proficiency (ELP) across the state for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities. The Initial Alternate ELPAC and Summative Alternate ELPAC assess ELP for potential and identified English learner (EL) students in an integrated manner: Expressive (Speaking and Writing) and Receptive (Listening and Reading) skills.

In addition, to ensure students can fully access and participate in the Alternate ELPAC, they can use their individually preferred modes of communication.

In May 2022, the California State Board of Education (SBE) approved the threshold scores for the Alternate ELPAC, and the following reporting scale score ranges.

### Initial Alternate ELPAC Overall Scale Score Ranges

Students will receive an Overall score that falls into one of three Performance Levels. As the Initial Alternate ELPAC is only administered once to eligible students, the same scale score ranges are used for all grade levels. The following table indicates which scores fall within each range.

### Summative Alternate ELPAC Overall Scale Score Ranges

Students will receive an Overall score that falls into one of three Performance Levels. The Summative Alternate ELPAC is administered annually to measure a student's ELP until they are reclassified as fluent English proficient. The following table indicates which scores fall within each range.
